

every student, whatever their background, has a fulfilling experience of higher education that enriches their lives and careers.

Outcomes

Objective 1

All students, from all backgrounds, with the ability and desire to undertake higher education, are supported to access, succeed in, and progress from higher education.

Objective 2

All students, from all backgrounds, receive a high quality academic experience, and their interests are protected while they study or in the event of provider, campus or course closure.

Objective 3

All students, from all backgrounds, are able to progress into employment, further study, and fulfilling lives, and their qualifications hold their value over time.

Value for money

Objective 4

All students, from all backgrounds, receive value for money.



The regulatory framework

Provider level regulation

- Go through a registration process
 - Not compulsory but route to public funding, student loans, tier 4 licences, degree awarding powers and university title
 - Providers are checked for compliance with 24 conditions (ranging from access and participation to financial sustainability)
 - We can register a provider with specific conditions or enhanced monitoring
- Are regulated on an ongoing basis
 - Providers must comply with ongoing conditions
 - OfS gathers information but only investigates where there is a risk of a breach of condition
 - Ultimately can sanction or even de-register

The regulatory framework

Sector level regulation

OfS has a role to create conditions for improvement over and above the baseline conditions.

- Transparency
- Student engagement
- Improve information, advice and guidance for students (IAG)
- Improve quality of teaching (Teaching Excellence Framework)
- Funding
- Convening and collaboration

Future priorities and activity

- Review of registration process
- Establishing ongoing monitoring and intervention
- Admissions review
- Mental health
- New guidance from the Secretary of State (this week), prioritising
 - Revisiting baselines on quality as part of improving VfM
 - Further reform of TEF
 - Review of admissions (inc. PQA)
 - Action on marketing practices such as unconditional offers
 - Student contracts
 - Incentivising innovation in provision (e.g. flexible, part-time, accelerated) especially for mature students
